Theme: Time Travellers

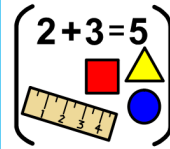


Multisensory English and Phonic Awareness



To begin the school year we will be reading the story 'The Oak Tree'. Pupils will then participate in activities related to the story, for example, planting a seed. Later in the Autumn term we will begin to explore poetry.

Phonic Awareness will be taught using our newly formed Phonics resources bags. Each week we will focus on a different theme to encourage the pupils to broaden their exposure to phonetic sounds.



Multisensory Maths

Multisensory Maths begins the year with number work. Pupils will engage in a range of counting activities which mainly involve animals to link to our Multisensory Science topic. Some of the activities include number songs and a whole lesson focusing on the Hungry Caterpillar.

From this we will then move on to measurement where pupils can again link their learning in Multisensory Science. We will be figuring out how to measure the length of different toy insects and animals as well as branches and leaves. We will also spend some time measuring staff and pupils in Leopard Class.



Multisensory Science

Multisensory Science is all about dead and alive this term. This links in well with our Multisensory English as we learn about trees and the animals that live in them.

Physical Development



In Physical Development pupils will be learning how to move their bodies in different ways. We will also use this time to further embed physio plans. Pupils will have access to soft play during the week where they can complete their learning in a different environment.



Multisensory PSHE

Multisensory PSHE allows us to explore our emotions during the Autumn term. We will be doing a lot of work around the colour monster with a different emotion to focus on each week.

Multisensory Computing



During our Multisensory Computing sessions we will continue to work on our abilities to intentionally use cause and effect equipment.



Discovery

In Discovery we are learning about the Battle of Hastings 1066. Pupils will engage in sensory with opportunities for further exploration of relative materials.

Creative links in very well with our Discovery topic as we will be using the Tapestry Bayeux for inspiration to create our own art.
